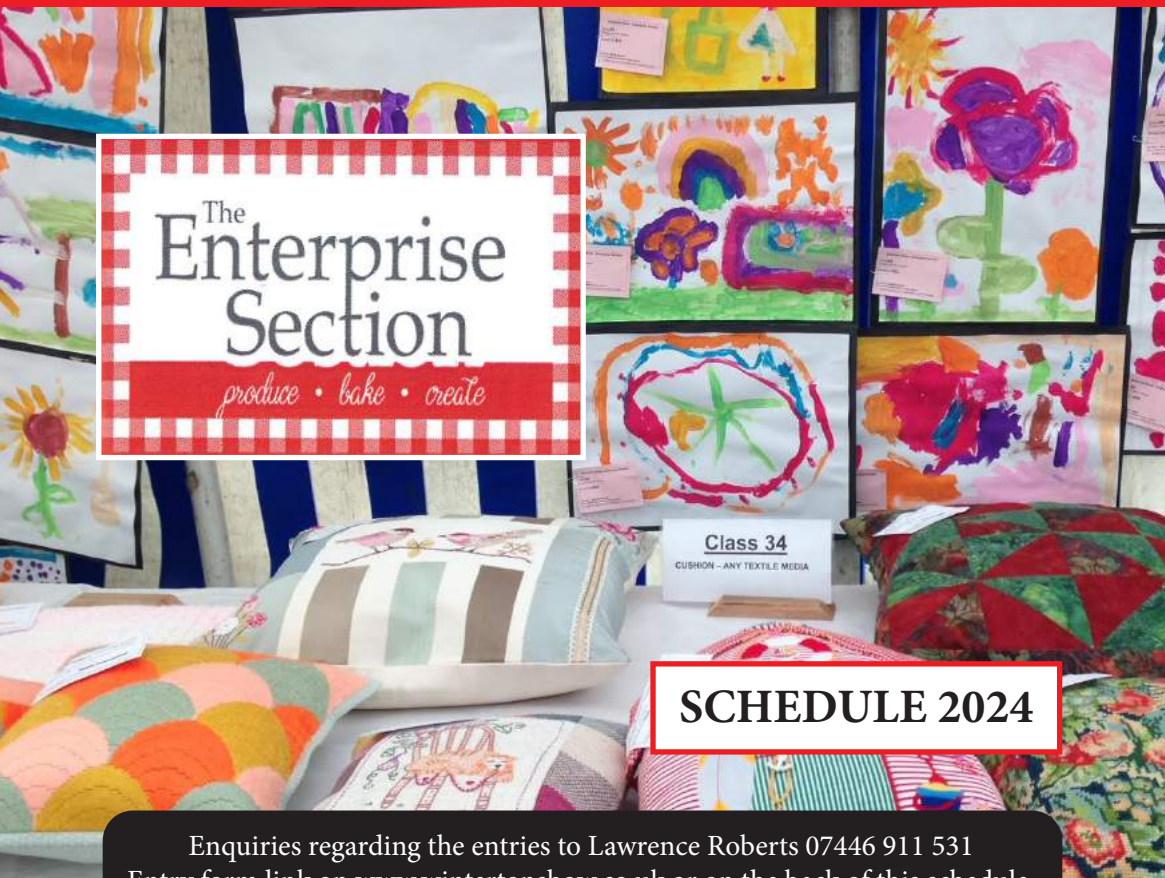

Greetings

from the Enterprise Team

I hope you will all agree that, with the help of friends and family, we managed a reasonably ordered transition of this Tent to “new management” in 2023 and would dearly love to build on this in 2024. We have had plenty of time to reflect on the feedback received, and spoken to as many potential contributors as we can to try and keep interest in these classes alive.

But first we must pay tribute to Mr Pip Ashton, who passed away early this year. He was a dedicated judge for the wine and beer section and brought great enthusiasm to the role. His would be a hard act to follow but Mr Xavier Brette, the general manager of Winteringham Fields has agreed to bring his trained palate to the role.

A most important change this year is that we are abolishing entry fees for adults and children. The sums of money involved were often small (although in a large and competitive family they could really add-up) and the extra admin involved in floats, having change etc did not seem proportionate. It also felt rather parsimonious taking fees from school entries when they provide so much enjoyment for so many. Similarly, there will be no adult monetary prizes – the value was tiny and often unclaimed. Children’s prizes are of course maintained, they are valued so highly by the winners, and we will be awarding trophies on the Sunday, as usual. Any sponsorship received will go directly to funding the children’s prizes.

We were disappointed to not get our electronic entry system where we wanted it last year. We ran into a roadblock with attempting automated e-mail acknowledgement of entries, we just couldn’t make it work in time. This year the committee has funded further improvements and I am hoping that it will all run a lot more smoothly but with a printable summary of entries being available to all electronic entrants.

We have several new classes this year, all suggested by the people of the town and surrounds, we hope you will feel encouraged to enter.

Rules and Information for Exhibitors

- 1 All classes are open to Amateurs only.
- 2 **Only two entries per person per class (3 entries in photography)**
- 3 All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor; and must be available for showing for the 2 days of the Show Saturday and Sunday.
- 4 **Entering Exhibits.** Schools may submit entries for multiple pupils via the Winterton Show Website, or by direct submission of a spreadsheet to theenterprisesection@gmail.com. Separate instructions on spreadsheet submission will be distributed when this Schedule is released. School painting, collage and handwriting physical entries to be with us by Thursday 27th June 2024, others by 1st July 2024. Collection from the school will be arranged. Pupils may submit additional individual entries up to the limit of entries per class.
Individuals (adults or children) may submit entries via the Winterton Show Website, or by completion and delivery of the Entry form opposite. Physical entries should then be delivered to the Enterprise Tent between 0800 and 0945 on Saturday 6th July. Temporary parking is provided. Exhibitor cards and means of attaching them to your exhibit will be provided. Stewards will place your anonymised exhibit in the tent, cars should be removed from the site by 1000.
- 5 **The marquee must be clear of all people except the judges and stewards by 10.00 am prompt.**
- 6 Exhibits will be available for public viewing following judging at or around 12.30 pm on the Saturday and from 10.00 am on Sunday until 3.45 pm. Exhibits must be collected between 4.00 and 5.00 on the Sunday of the Show, they may not be collected earlier.
- 7 After this time - perishables will be disposed of.
Could schools please arrange collection please.
- 8 There will be a prize giving ceremony in the marquee at around 3.45 pm on Sunday 7th July.
- 9 Previous cups and trophies remain the property of Winterton Show unless otherwise stated. If you have any trophies from previous years would you please return them to The Enterprise Marquee during the weekend of the Show, or to Lawrence Roberts at the above address.

The Star trophies awarded to the children will be theirs to keep.
